# Below the Surface- The Boast of Fools. Sermon Notes April 1, 2018

## Welcome to the gathering of fools! Why do I say that?

- We are here celebrating a man who died nearly 2000 years ago and came back to life three days later.
- Not only are we celebrating that man, but we call him "Lord", the living Son of God.
- Additionally, we give our lives over to his leadership—a resurrected Lord we cannot even see.
- Lastly, we anticipate our own resurrection that we will be united with him forever.

Any one of those four things can warrant a response from society as foolish, or only a fool could believe that.

#### Why would I believe such a story?

- The story is told by a group of people who suffered greatly telling the same story.
- His tomb was empty in spite of the great care to protect it.
- This story of good news (the gospel) has changed my life.

#### The Gospel story. 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

- 1. The perfect lamb, Jesus Christ, died for your sins. (3)
- 2. He was buried and rose again on the third day. (4)
- 3. Testified to by witnesses. He appeared to many: the 12, an additional 500 followers, James his brother, and then to Paul—the least of all because he had persecuted the church. (6-9)

## Boasting in our weakness so as to glorify our Lord. 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

- We are a group of unlikely ambassadors. (26)
- God chose such a crew to show that it is his power and glory being manifested—how else could you explain us! (27-29)
- So, we boast of our weakness so that our boasting glorifies the risen Christ who has redeemed us and changed us completely.
- We boast in the Lord!

### Paul's testimony of boasting. 2 Corinthians 10:17; 11:16-30

- Boast in the Lord.
- Life has been brutal, but he has survived!
- He still struggles with sin, but he is victorious because of Jesus.
- If I must boast as the world, then I will boast in my weakness and my need of Jesus!
  (30)

**1 Corinthians 1:18** *"The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."* 

The boast of fools—we were nothing until Jesus saved us. It's true!
