Sermon 4.7.19 Sermon Outline

In these texts (Luke 15:1-7 and Luke 19:1-10), Luke answers the question, "Why did Jesus come?" Luke 19:10 states, "The Son of Man came to seek and save the lost."

If that is the case, then who is lost? Who did Jesus come to seek and save? In these texts we'll hear Jesus address this tension with the tax collectors and sinners, as well as the Pharisees. He'll do this by sharing a parable and modeling it with Zacchaeus.

Outline:

Luke 15:1-2

Jesus, again sees this tension (the different approaches to sin) and addresses it

- by telling this parable in 15:3-7
- and modeling it for us in 19:1-10.
