Hopes common to mankind.

- Hope found in their heritage and status.
- Hope found in their resources—money, skills, intellect.
- Hope found in political movements. Osborne
- Hope found in the new idea. Osborne [Example: Zimbabwe]
- Hope found in powerful and influential people. [Illustration: Jerry]

Lasting hope is not changed by the circumstances. Daniel 6:10-16

- Daniel did not change his pattern of prayer. (10a)
 - 3x a day.
 - Window open and facing Jerusalem.
- Daniel did not change the content of his prayers. (10b)
 - Prayers of thankfulness.
- Daniel did not change who he prayed too! (10b)
- Daniel's reputation of serving God continually did not change! (16)
- God did not change in his blessing of Daniel and changing the hearts of kings.

Lasting hope navigates the foggy present in hope of a clear future. Daniel 12:1-13

- There is blessing in not knowing tomorrow.
- Knowing tomorrow in light of today can confuse. (8)
- God's advice to keep walking faithful and you will be blessed. (12)

Avoiding the trap of false hope. 1 Timothy 3:15, 4:7-16

1. Commit to church as a pillar for truth. (15)

- 2. Commit to a church that teaches the Word of Truth. (7, 13)
- 3. Commit to spiritual training. (7b, 8)
- 4. Put your hope in the Living God who saves you. (10)
