SUNDAY'S SERMON // SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 28 EPHESIANS 4:1-6 // WALKING AS ONE

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Use these questions in your community (family, life group, ABF, etc.) to apply this sermon in your life.

1. Read Ephesians 4:1-6 aloud. Tyler focused on the repetition of the theme of "one" in this text. Because of the mystery of the gospel laid out in Ephesians 1-3, we as the body of Christ are unified as one. Would you say that you see great unity among Christians in America and around the world today? Why or why not?
2. Are you living unified with those in the body of Christ? Is there tension in your family? Would you be able to have someone from the opposite political party as you in your Life Group? Someone of a different skin color? What holds us back from embracing unity in some of these situations?
3. Verse 1 commands us to live a life worthy of the calling we have received. What is this calling? What does a life worthy of that look like? What are some characteristics of someone living out the calling?
4. Verse 3 calls us to actively keep unity through peace. Why is peace the chosen characteristic? What would the church look like if we all pursued peace?
5. As you talked, were you able to identify someone in your Oikos who you many not feel very unified with? Maybe there is tension or outright hostility. What steps do you need to pursue with them to achieve peace through the gospel?
