

# SUNDAY'S SERMON // SUNDAY, DECEMBER 19 ISAIAH 9:6-7 // MIGHTY GOD

### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

Use these questions in your community (family, life group, ABF, etc.) to apply this sermon in your life.

- 1. Share about a time in your life when you've experienced the might of God. What did he do in you or for you? Were you left in awe of his power? How did others around you experience that?
- 2. What other powerful or mighty things or people, other than God, have you been tempted to find protection in? How has that turned out?
- 3. Throughout the Old Testament, God the Father is repeatedly declared as Almighty. Read Genesis 17:1, 28:3, 35:11; Exodus 6:3; Deuteronomy 3:24, 10:17; Psalm 50:1-, 62:7, 71:18, 89:8; Nehemiah 9:32; Job 36:5; Isaiah 37:16 and Zephaniah 3:17. Reflect on these passages and discuss anything that makes an impression on your heart.
- 4. In the New Testament, the Son is included in the declarations of Almighty God. Read Luke 22:66-71; Ephesians 6:10-11 and 1 Peter 5:5-7 and similarly reflect on these passages.
- 5. Repeatedly in Revelation we see Jesus declared as Almighty God. These declarations come from Christ himself and all of creation! (Revelation 1:7-9; 4:8; 11:16-17; 15:2-4; 19:5-7). As you pray together, be sure to include time to reflect on his might and declare that he is Almighty God.
